## Moldy beauty

The Promega Corp. has an interesting art exhibit of large and unusual photographs by Andre Ferrella at its 5445 E. Cheryl Parkway address, off Fish Hatchery Road, near La Paella restaurant.

The color photos have a celestial and cosmic, yet delicate, appearance.

The photographs are of mold.

That's right, mold, a downy or furry growth caused by fungi.

Ferrella induces mold formation on negatives, then tweaks the negatives by painting, scratching, hand treating or chemically treating them before he makes final prints. The results are ethereally fascinating and beautiful.

As noted, the photos are large. One is nearly 8 feet high, while others are nearly 4 feet high by 2½ feet wide.

The exhibit is open to the public from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. on business days, or by appointment. (Call 277-2502.) It runs through May 30.
